- Involvement in applied research in cooperation with the business sector, as well as research and development (r&d) work at university and research institutes, together with technology transfer
- Teaching course includes contents of the Bachelor and Master's degree courses
- Interdisciplinary cooperation in the fields of communication and bionics
- Teaching basic courses and optional courses in German and English in the context of the teaching area, also in the evening and at the weekend
- Practical training for our students regarding tools of trade such as storytelling, communication design, camera techniques, cutting, dealing journalistically with statistics, etc.

- A degree in information, communication or possibly also in sociology of science and pertinent doctorate
- Practical professional experience in science journalism (also regarding audiovisual formats) and in communicating science and innovation for companies or other institutions; eventually also expience with regulatory processes / technology assessment or management

- Excellent command of the English language is essential

- Research expiernces in science communication, preferably beyond media studies, for instance in areas such as media economics or public affairs

The general **statutory employment prerequisites** result from Section 36 of the Law regarding the Universities in the State of North Rhine-Westphalia (Hochschulgesetz – HG). Accordingly, the following are required in particular:

- a completed course of study in a pertinent subject at a scientific university
- special aptitude for scientific work, usually verified by the quality of a doctorate
- special achievements in applying or developing scientific knowledge and methods during a period of at least five years of professional experience, including at least three years outside the academic sector.

Those applicants not being German native speaker shall at least have basic knowledge of the German language.

The Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences promotes the professional development of women. Applications from women are therefore explicitly welcomed. In areas where women are not adequately represented, they shall be given preferential consideration when offering the same suitability, capability and professional achievements as men according to the Equal Opportunities Act of North Rhine-Westphalia (Landesgleichstellungsgesetz), unless there are exceptional reasons for giving preference to another applicant.

When offering the same suitability, preferential consideration shall be given to applications from suitable candidates with severe disabilities and equivalent persons pursuant to Section 2 (3) German Social Security Code, Book IX (SGB IX).
