Requirements for Acknowledgement of Preparatory Internships

International Relations, B.A.

- 1. The preparatory internship should generally be completed before enrolment at the Rhine-Waal University. However, students may submit certification of completion until their registration for the fourth semester (§ 4 General Examination Regulations).
- 2. The mandatory internship period of eight weeks should be completed within a company, a governmental body, the public administration, a non-profit organisation, or the media.
- 3. Students must prove that the chosen internship position relates sufficiently to the subjects in the curriculum of the study programme IR. The <u>following areas</u> are, for example, appropriate for acknowledgement:
 - Political Parties/Institutions
 - Political Foundations
 - Public Administration
 - Non-governmental Organisations
 - Charitable Institutions & Non-profit Associations
 - Voluntary Social Year
 - · Media, Public Relations, and Publishing
 - · Human Resources and Marketing
 - Companies, Firms (no simple auxiliary activities), Banking & Finance

As International Relations aims at studying cross-border phenomena, we <u>strongly encourage</u> students to look for an internship at an internationally operating organisation or company a/o in an area where international/intercultural aspects do play a role.

- 4. The internship may only be officially recognised when sufficient certification or documentation of completion is given by the employer. This should include a detailed report regarding the nature and quality of the work done.
- 5. Students have to prove that internship was full-time (not a student or side job) for a period of eight weeks. Recognition is also possible in case several internships have been done which fulfil the requirements, lasted less than eight weeks each a/o have been part time, <u>but total</u> eight weeks full time.
- 6. Commitments such as community service or army generally cannot be acknowledged.
- 7. Completed apprenticeships or training schemes in relevant fields (such as defined above) may be recognised.
- 8. Even if the requirements outlined in points 1 to 7 are fulfilled, the Rhine-Waal University reserves the right to deny recognition of work experience if the employer certifies that the student did not meet the expected requirements.
- 9. International exchange students in IR who are enrolled at universities abroad and do not intend on graduating or completing their degree at the Rhine-Waal University are exempt from the compulsory preparatory internship.
