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1 University total

1.1 Range of studies

Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences currently offers 36 degree programmes, of which 25 are bachelor’s degree programmes and eleven are master’s degree programmes. Nine degree programmes are taught in German, while 27 degree programmes are taught in English. Ten degree programmes can be studied extra-occupational (part-time) and eight can be studied as integrated degree programmes (dual study).

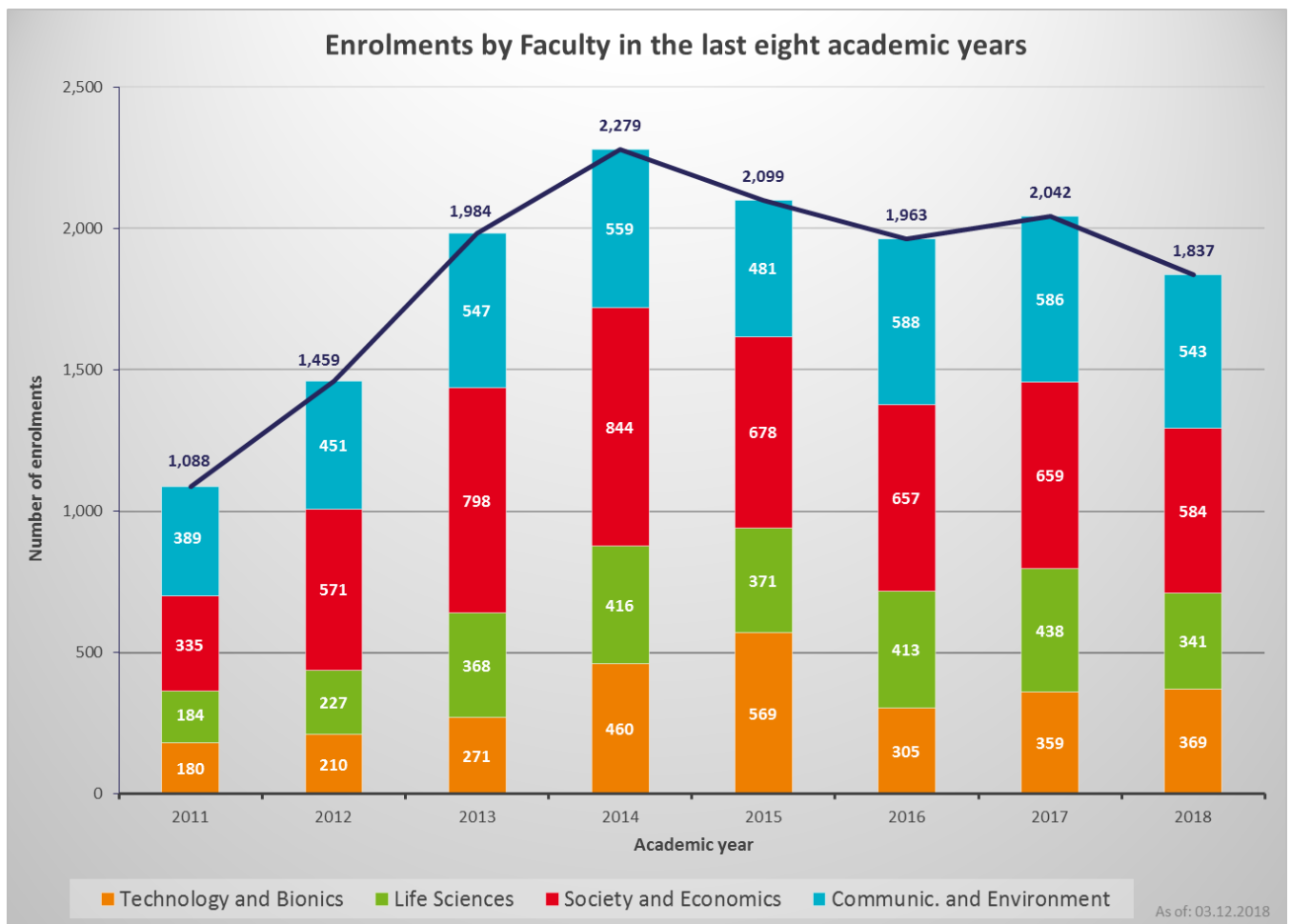
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1.2 Enrolments by Faculty

The Faculty of Society and Economics registered the highest number of enrolments in the current academic year with 584 enrolments, which corresponds to 32 per cent of the entire University. The Faculty of Communication and Environment followed closely with 543 enrolments (30 per cent). The two smaller Faculties, Technology and Bionics and Life Sciences, accounted for 369 (20 per cent) and 341 enrolments (18 per cent), respectively.

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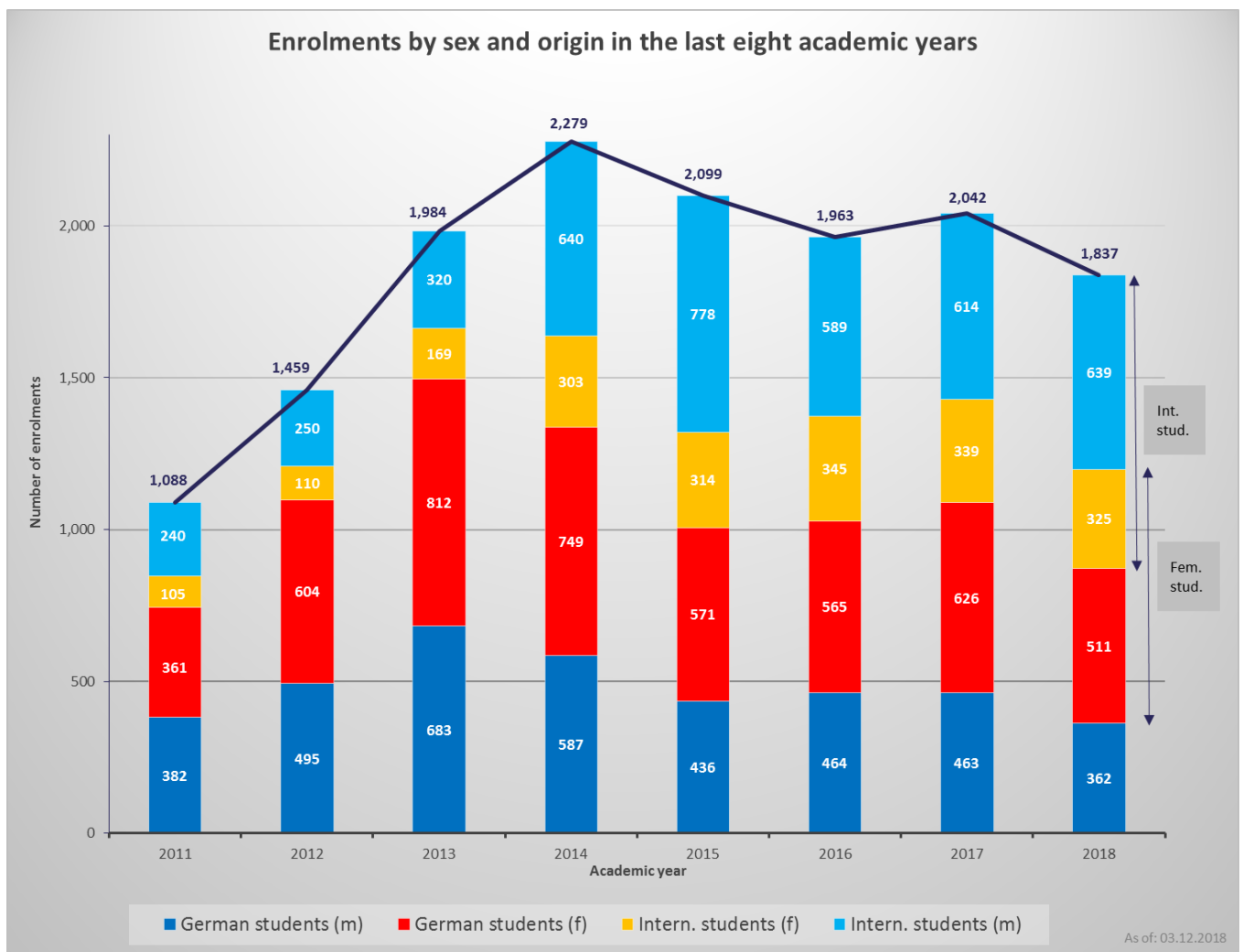


1.3 Enrolments by sex and origin

Female students accounted for 46 per cent of enrolments in the current academic year. Newly enrolled students from Germany accounted for 48 per cent of new enrolments and international students for 52 per cent. The largest single group are international male students (34 per cent), followed by German female students (28 per cent), German male students (20 per cent) and international female students with 18 per cent.

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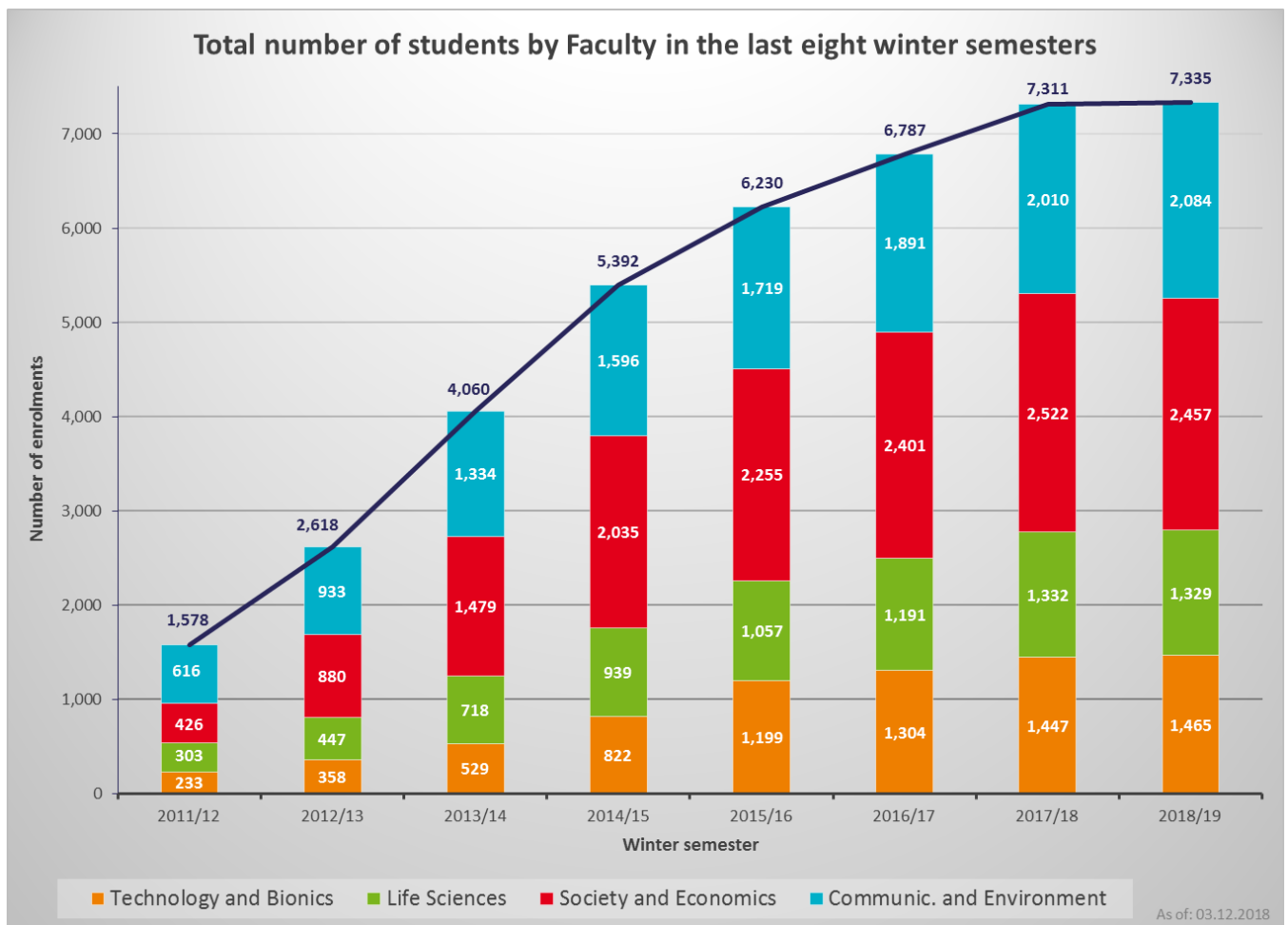
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1.4 Students by Faculty

The largest Faculty of Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences is Society and Economics with 2,457 currently enrolled students, which corresponds to 34 per cent. The Faculty of Communication and Environment follows second with 2,084 students, or 28 per cent of enrolled students. The two smaller Faculties, Technology and Bionics and Life Sciences, currently have 1,465 (20 per cent) and 1,329 (18 per cent) enrolled students, respectively.

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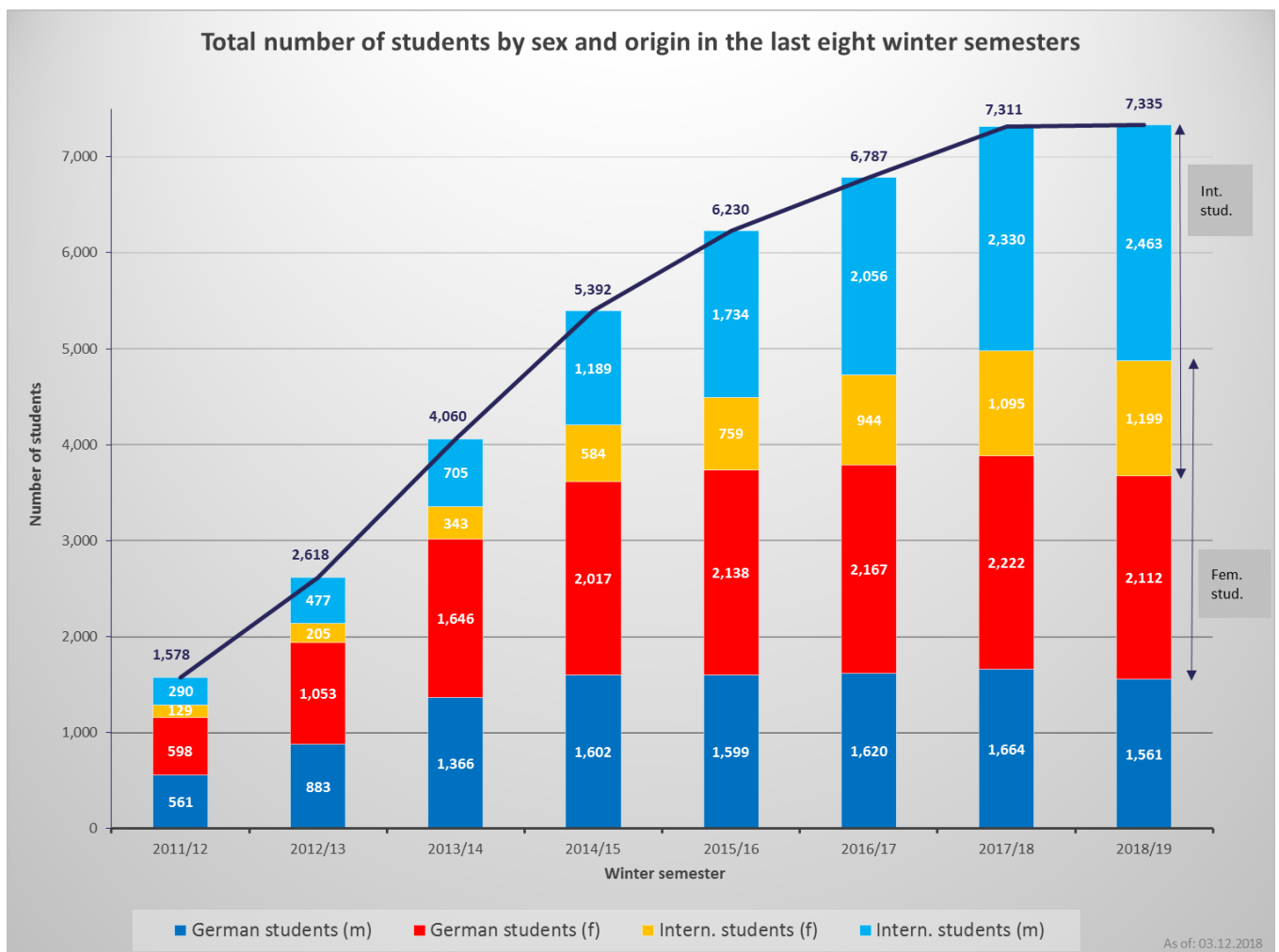


1.5 Students by sex and origin

The University currently has 3,311 female students (45 per cent overall) and 4,024 male students (55 per cent). Of these, 3,673 are German citizens and 3,662 are international students (50 per cent each). The largest single group are male international students (34 per cent), followed by German female students (29 per cent), German male students (21 per cent) and international female students (16 per cent).

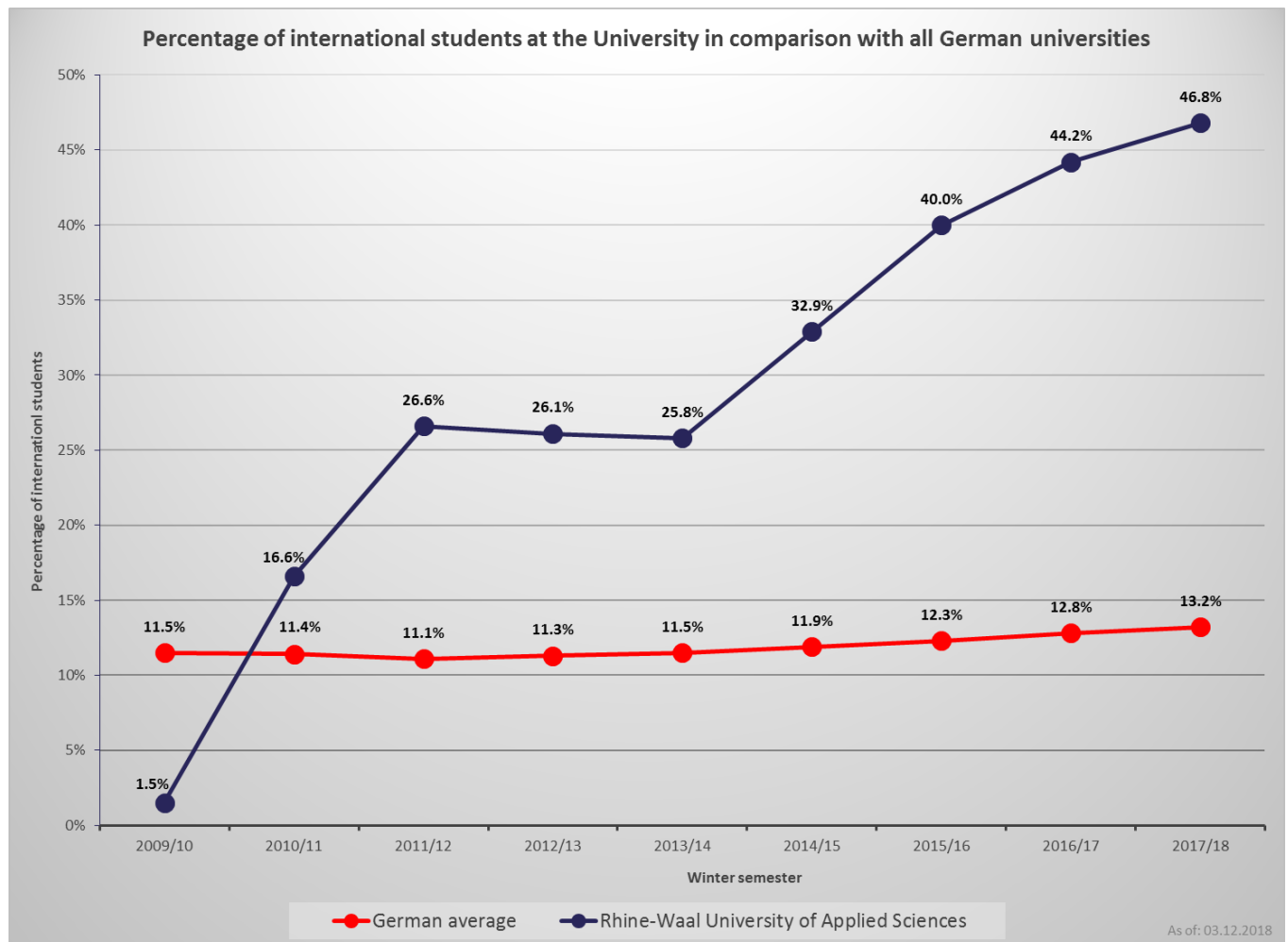

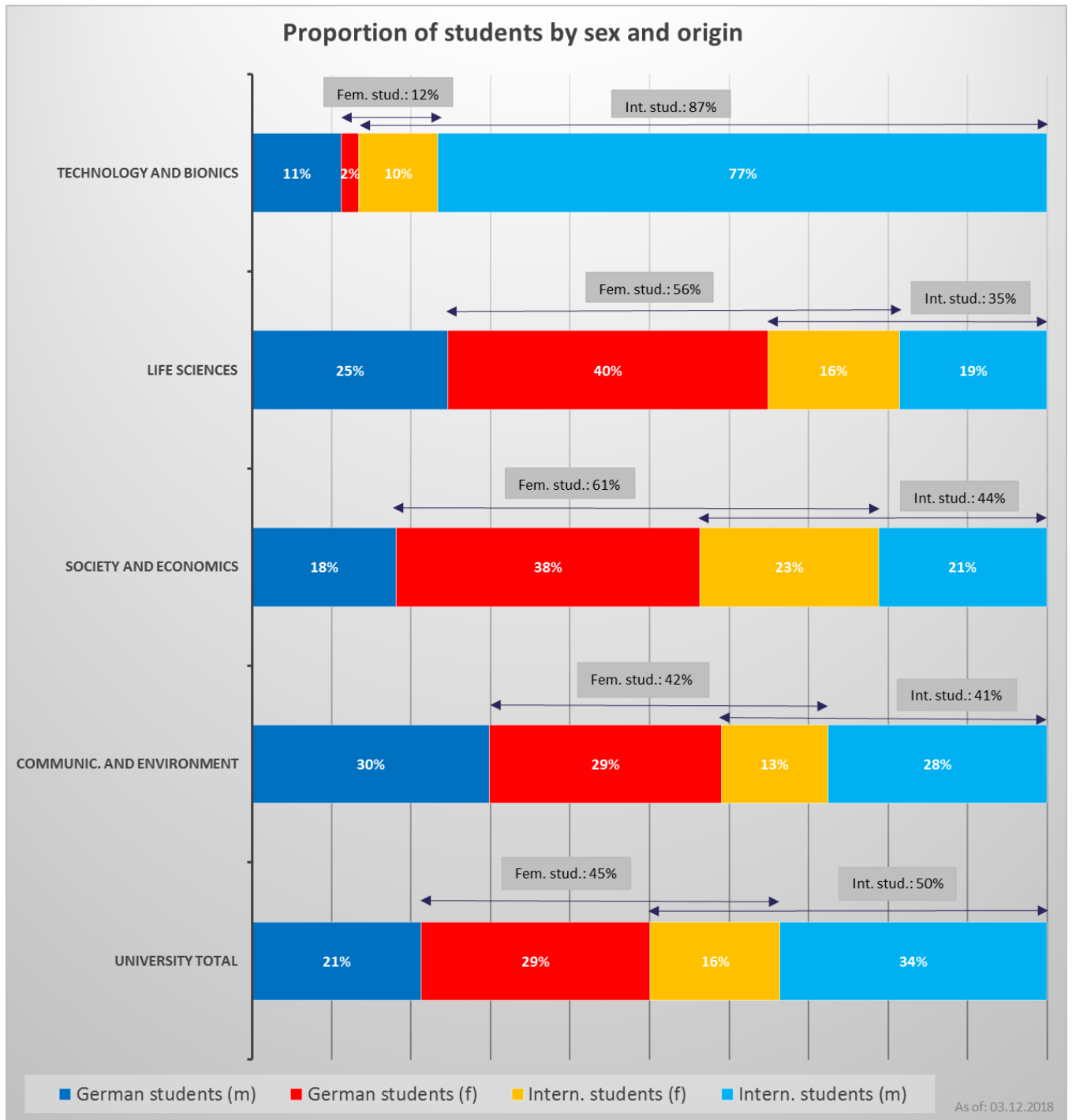
The following graph depicts the development of the percentage of international students at the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences in comparison with the average of all German universities until winter semester 2017/18.

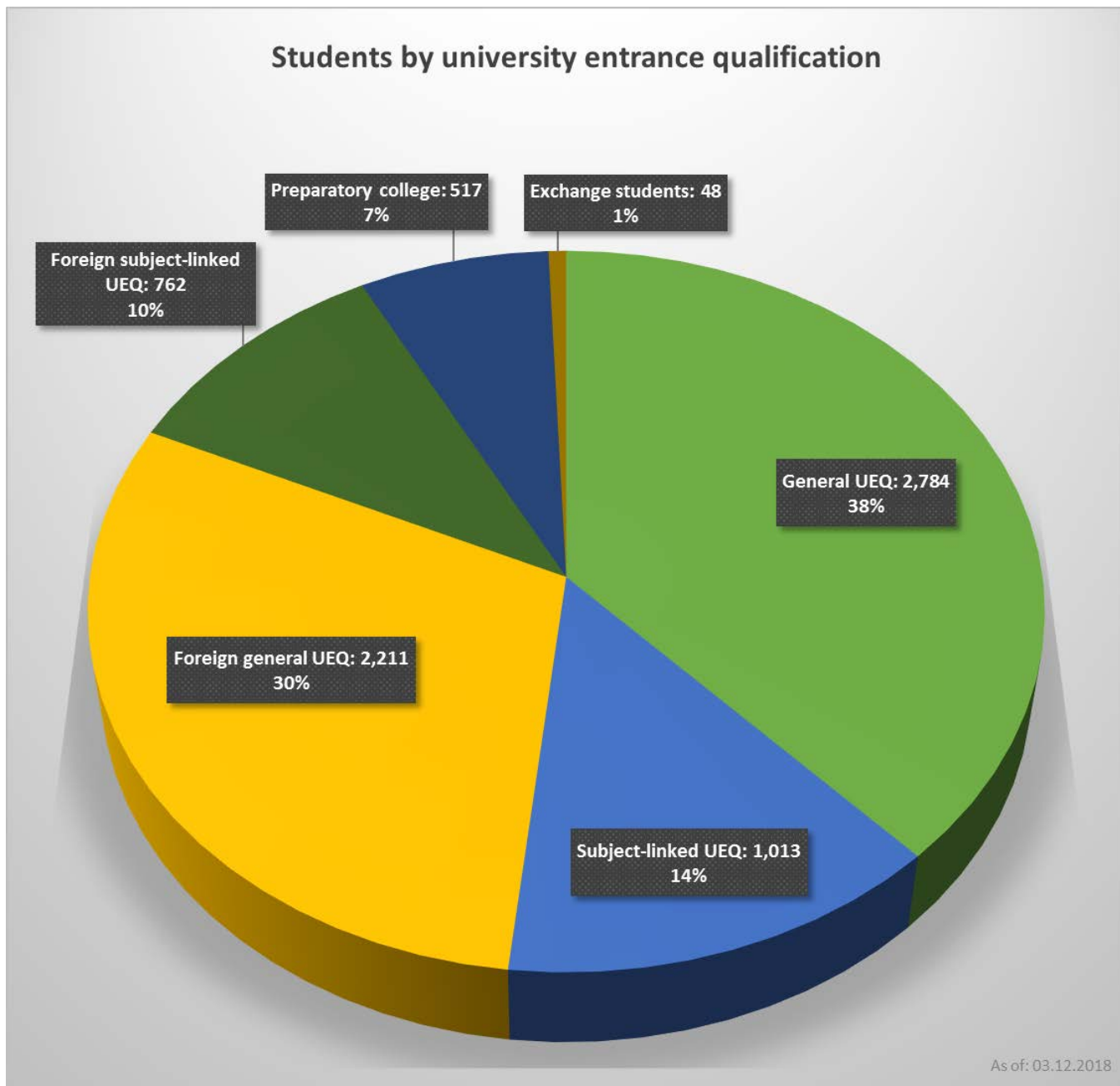

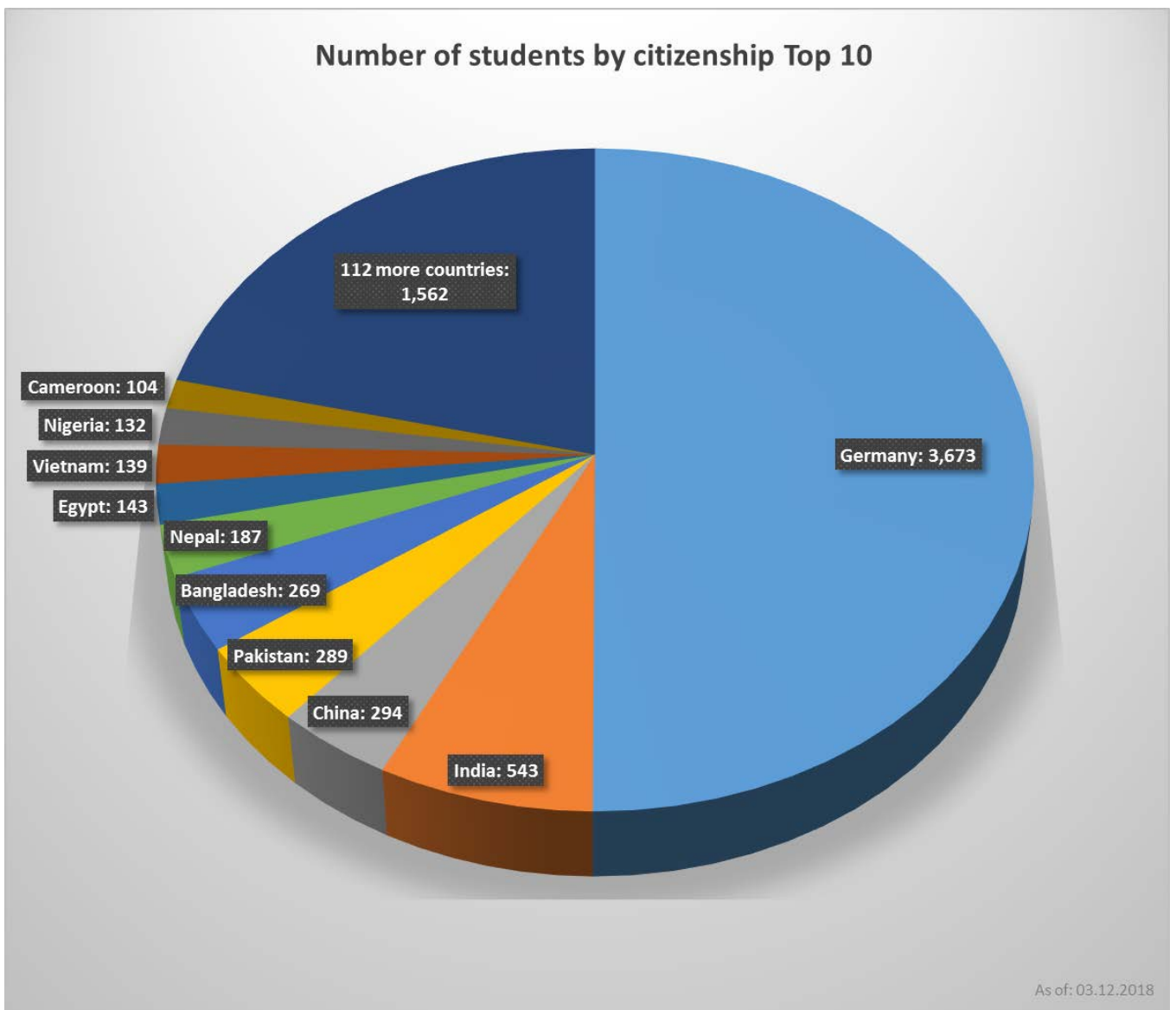
The following chart displays the number and the proportion of currently enrolled students by university entrance qualification (UEQ).



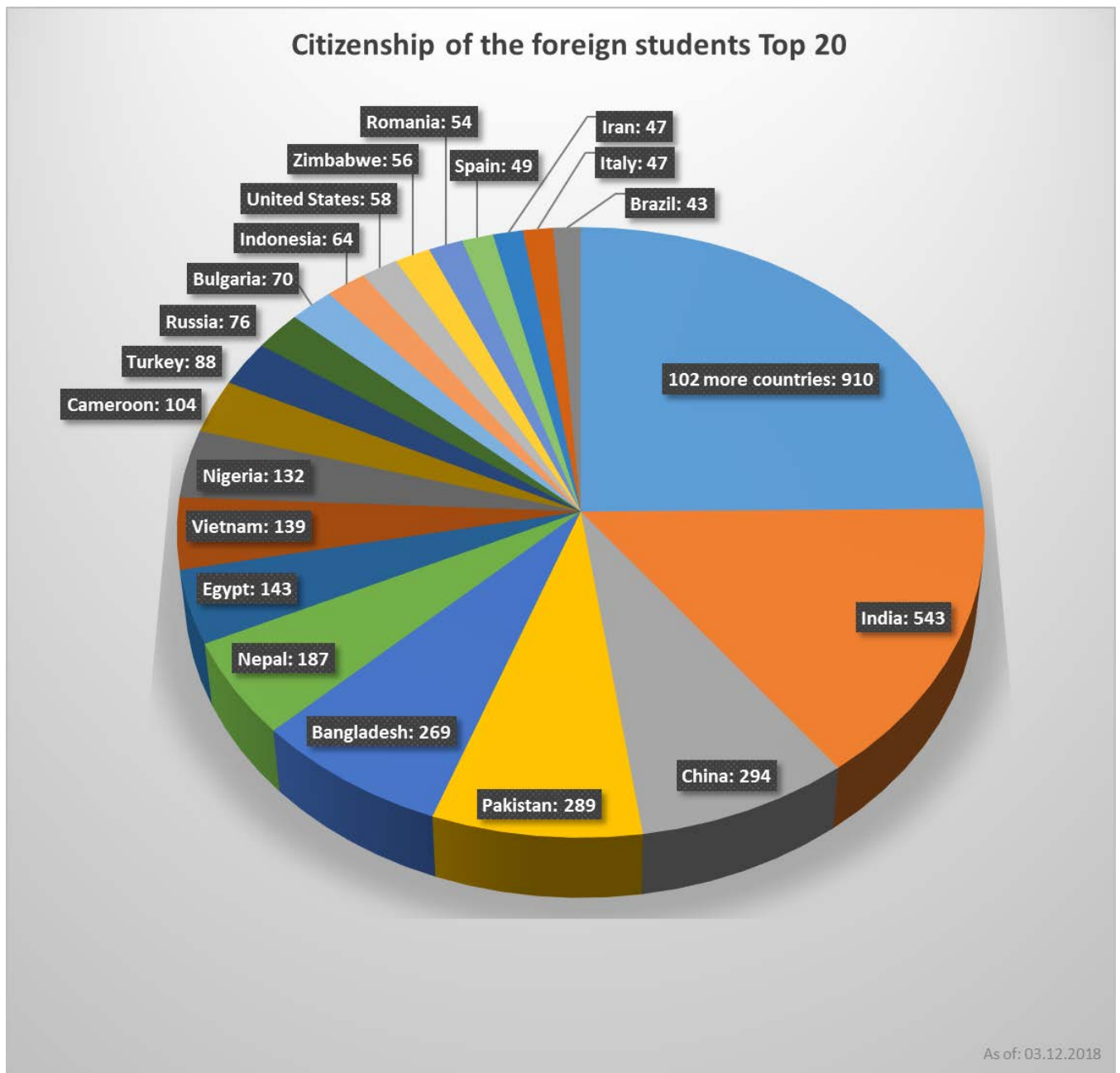
1.12 Students by citizenship

The largest group of students after Germans (50.1 per cent) are Indians with 7.4 per cent. This group is followed by Chinese students with 4.0 and Pakistani students with 3.9 per cent. In addition, more than two per cent of students are from Bangladesh (3.7) and Nepal with 2.5 per cent.

Overall, Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences currently has students from 122 countries. Of these, ten countries have a triple-digit (or four-digit) number of students.

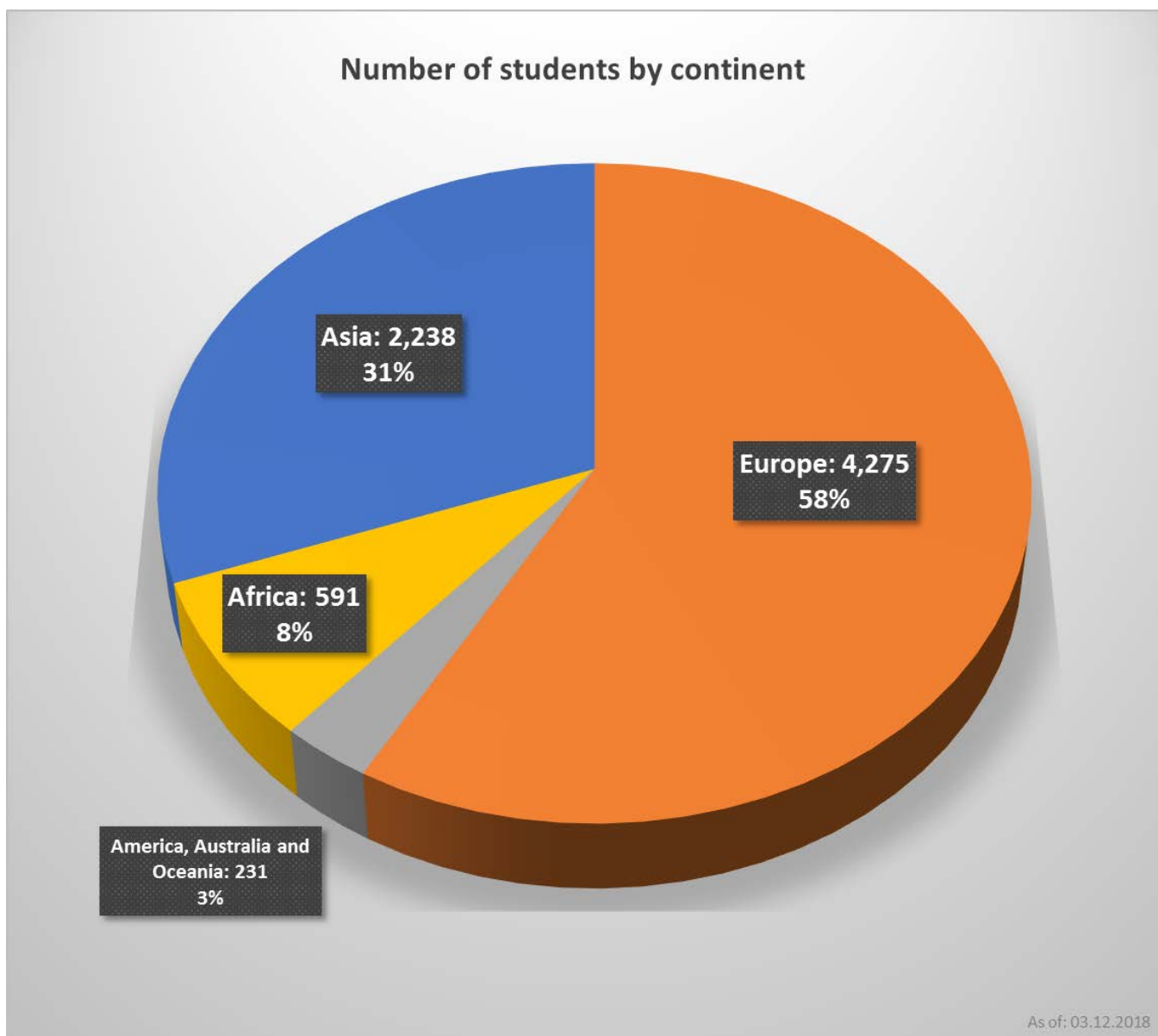


The top twenty foreign countries include nine from Asia, five from Europe, four from Africa, one North American and one South American country.

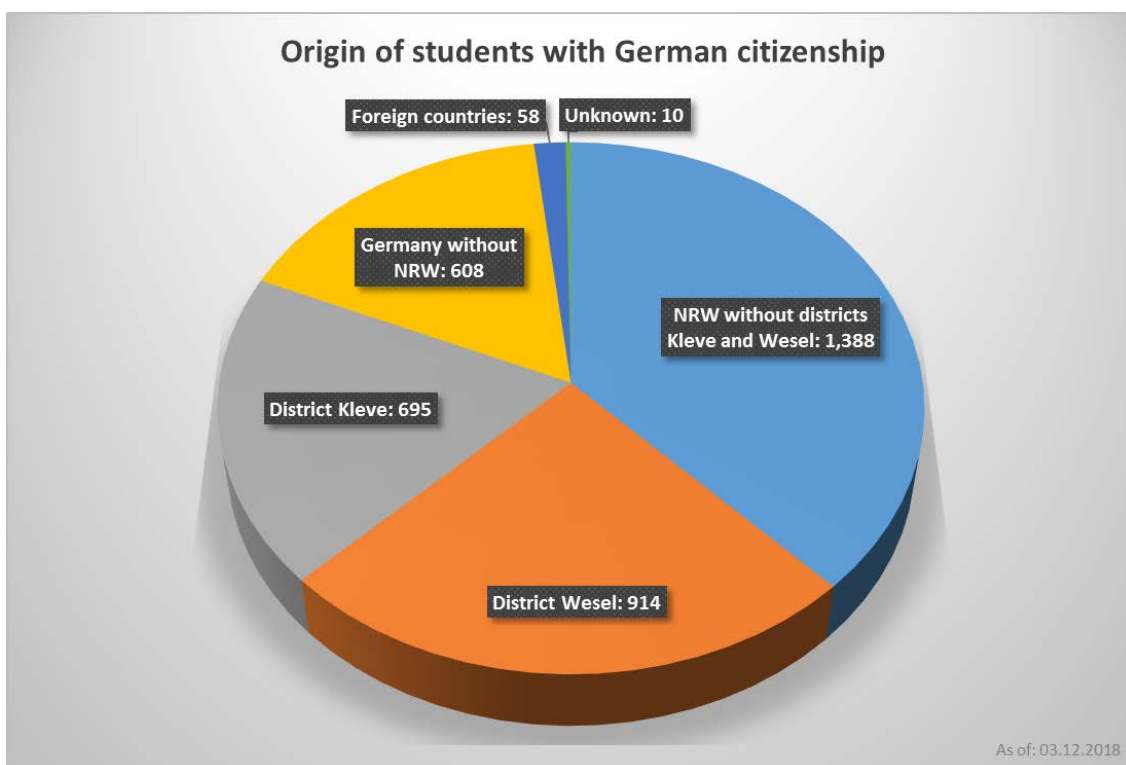
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1.15 Origin of German students

The following analysis focuses on *where students' university entrance qualification was obtained*. Accordingly, 58 students with German citizenship acquired their university entrance qualification abroad. A total of 2,997 German students obtained their qualification in North Rhine-Westphalia, which corresponds to 82 per cent.

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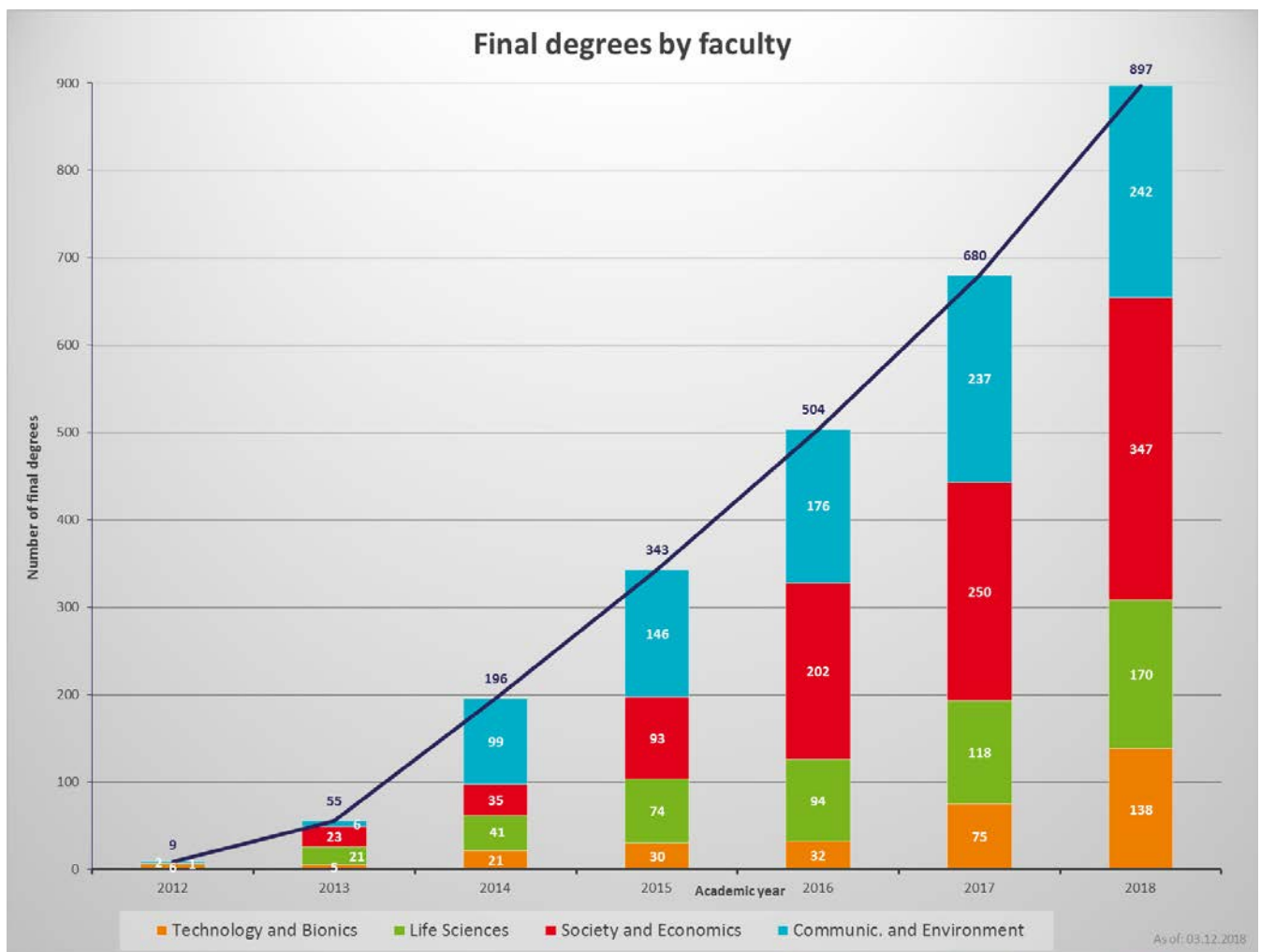

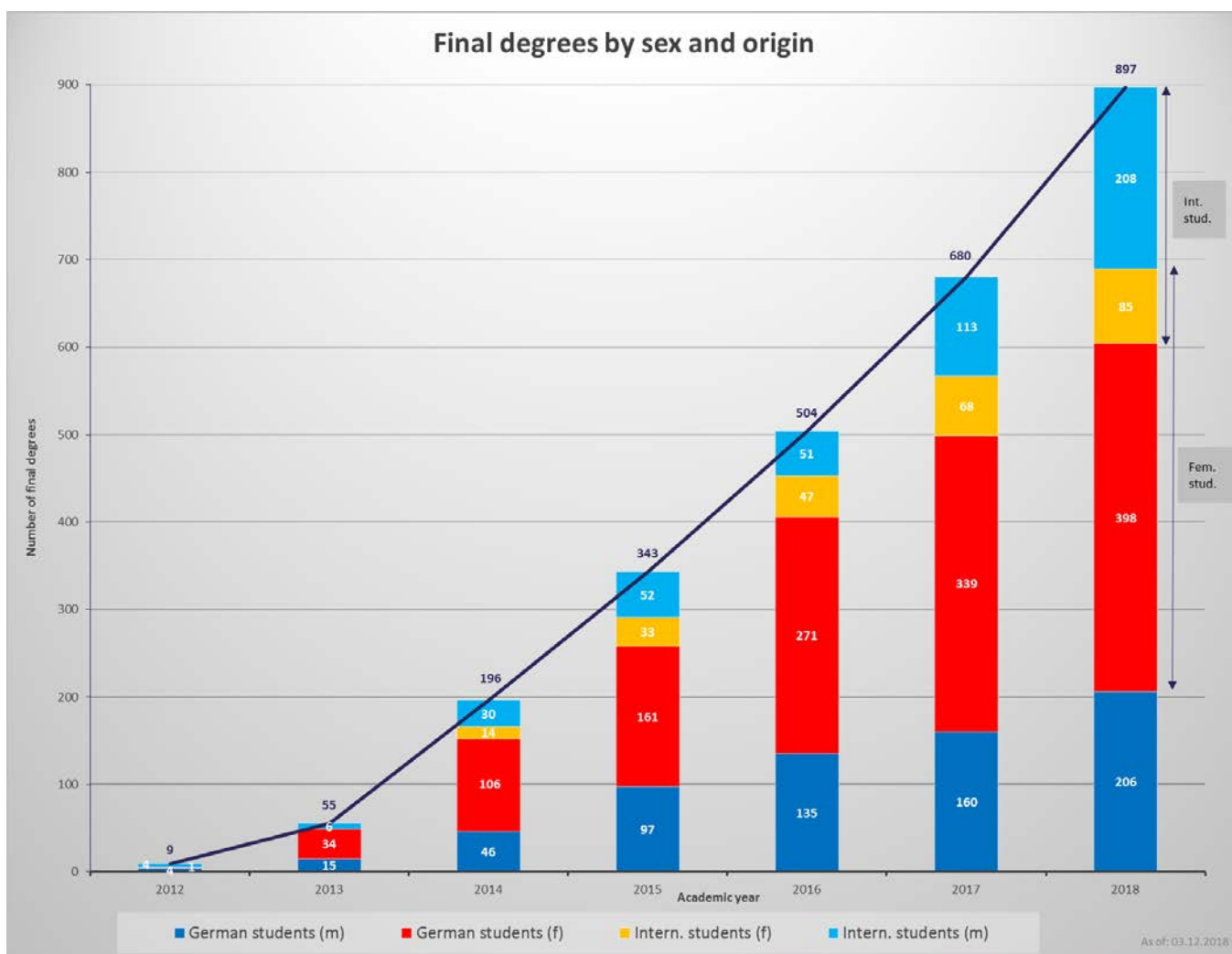

1.18 Employees of the University

As of 3 December 2018, the University had a total of 436.50 full-time positions (hereinafter called *full-time equivalents* or *FTE*).

The proportion of women employed at the University is 48 per cent, among professors 24 per cent (also in terms of full-time equivalents).

About 60 per cent of staff is employed in the Faculties (including administrative staff), while the remaining 40 per cent are employed in the Executive Board, the central institutions and the non-academic administration.

Staff members on maternity or parental leave are not factored into the calculation of full-time equivalents. Also excluded are student assistants, research assistants, tutors, student apprentices and sessional lecturers.

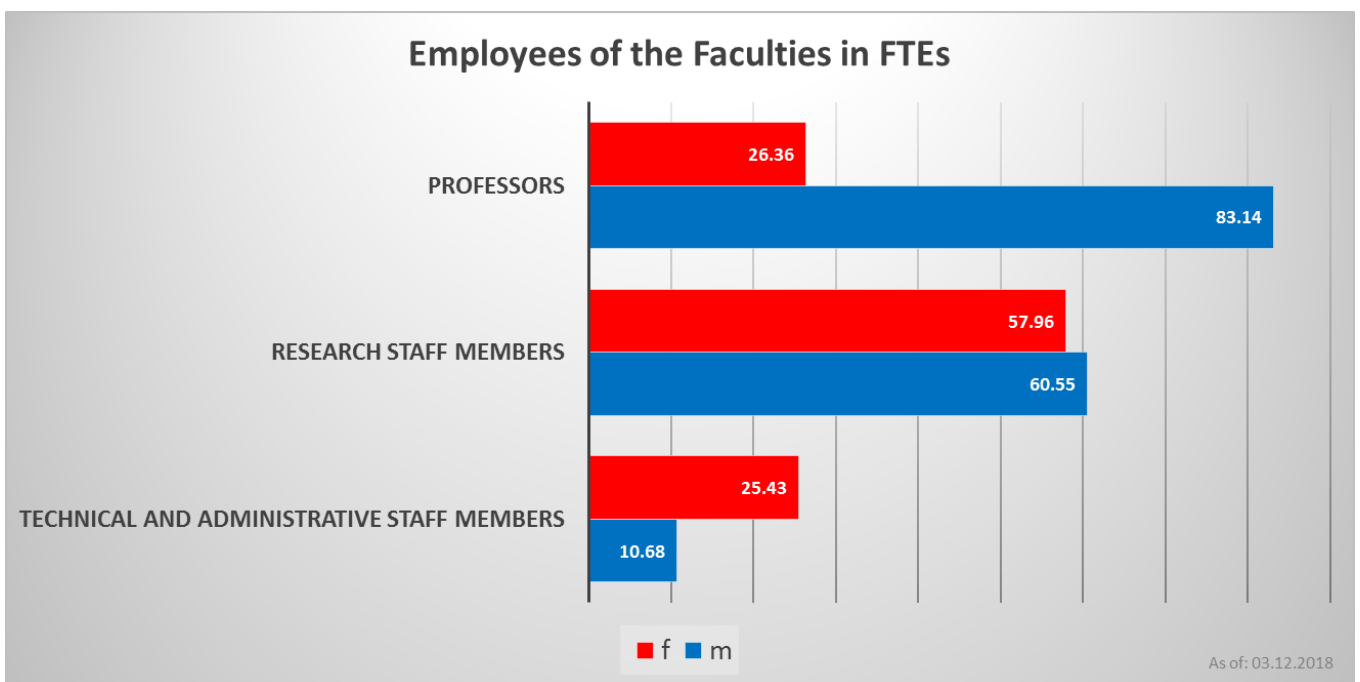

Female employees make up 42 per cent of Faculty staff (in terms of full-time equivalents).



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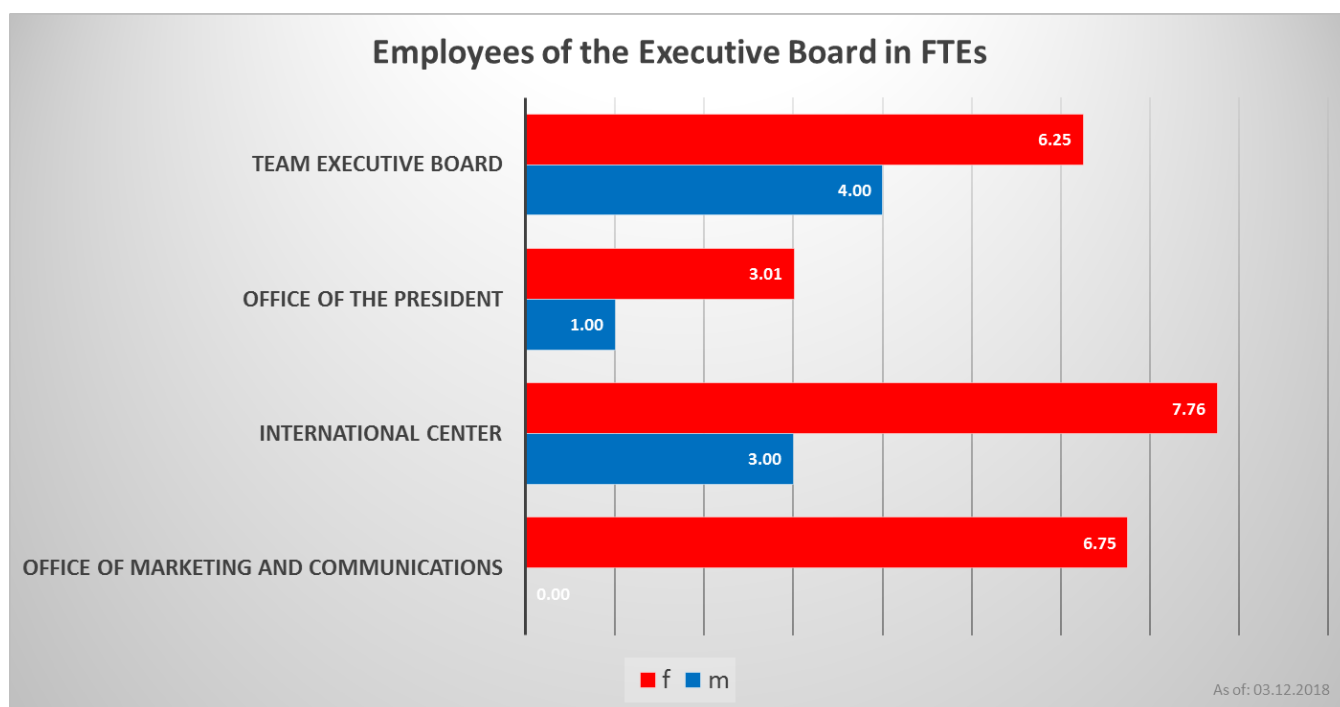

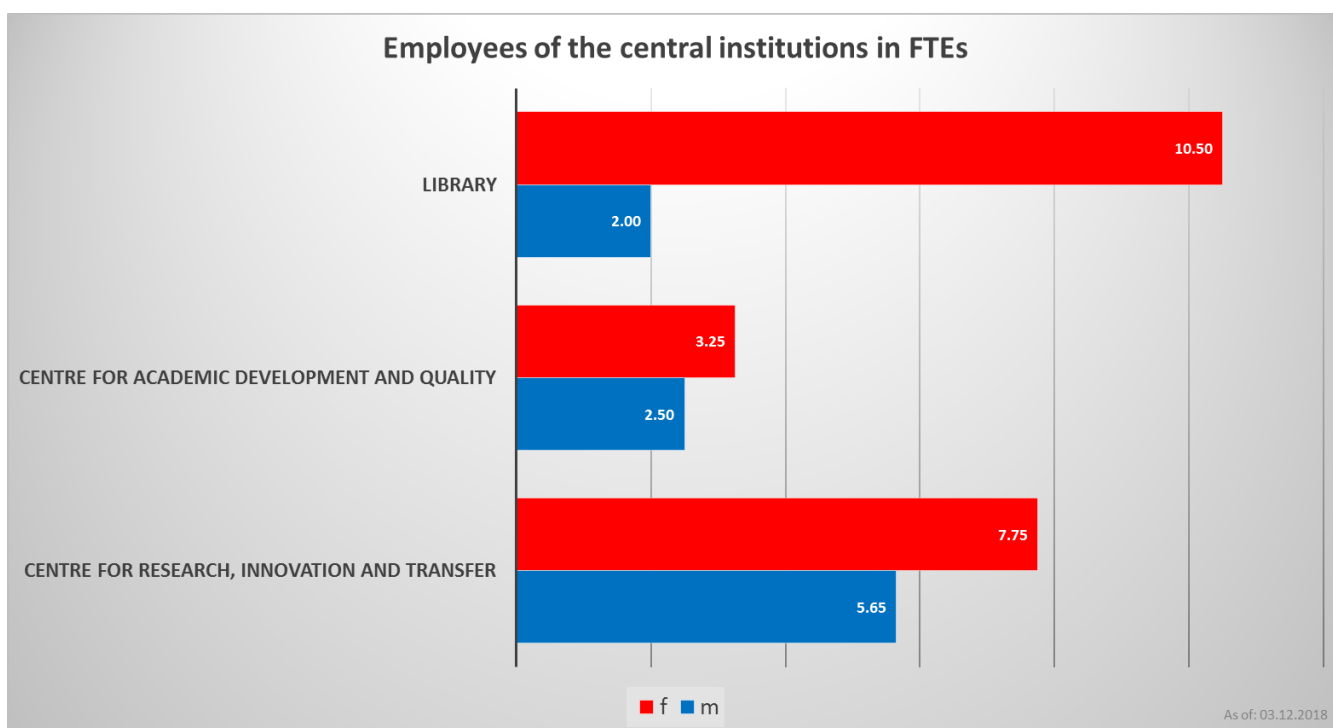

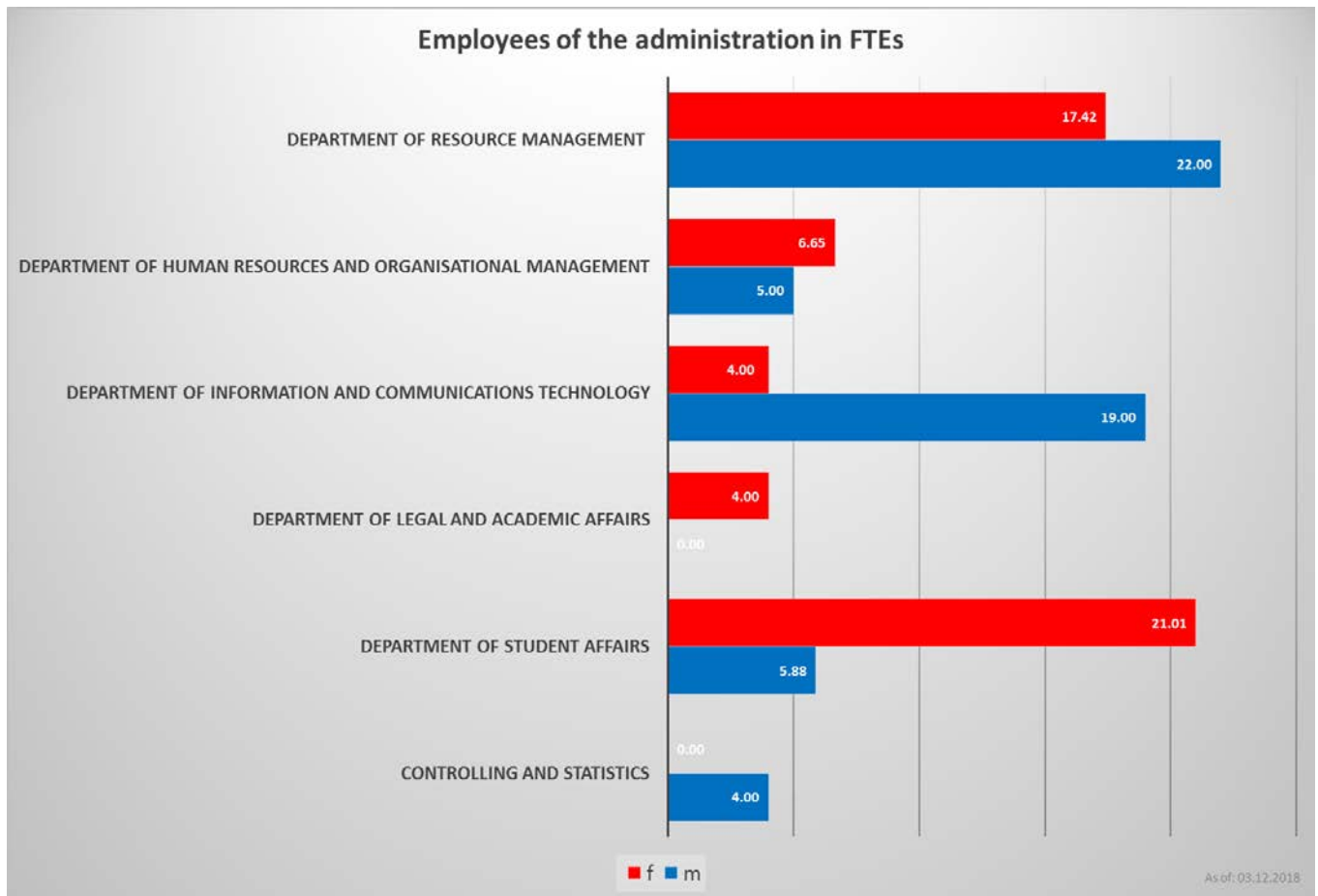

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Included in these figures are the five current apprentices of the administration, four of whom are in Department of Information and Communications Technology and one in Department of Resource Management.

Women make up 49 per cent of non-academic administrators (in terms of full-time equivalents). Upon closer look, however, distinct differences among the organisational units become apparent. In Department of Resource Management and Department of Human Resources and Organisational Management the proportion of women and men remains relatively balanced.

In Department of Legal and Academic Affairs, however, the proportion of women is currently 100 per cent and in Department of Student Affairs 78 per cent while on the other hand women only make up 17 per cent of staff in Department of Information and Communications Technology and zero per cent of staff in Controlling and Statistics.

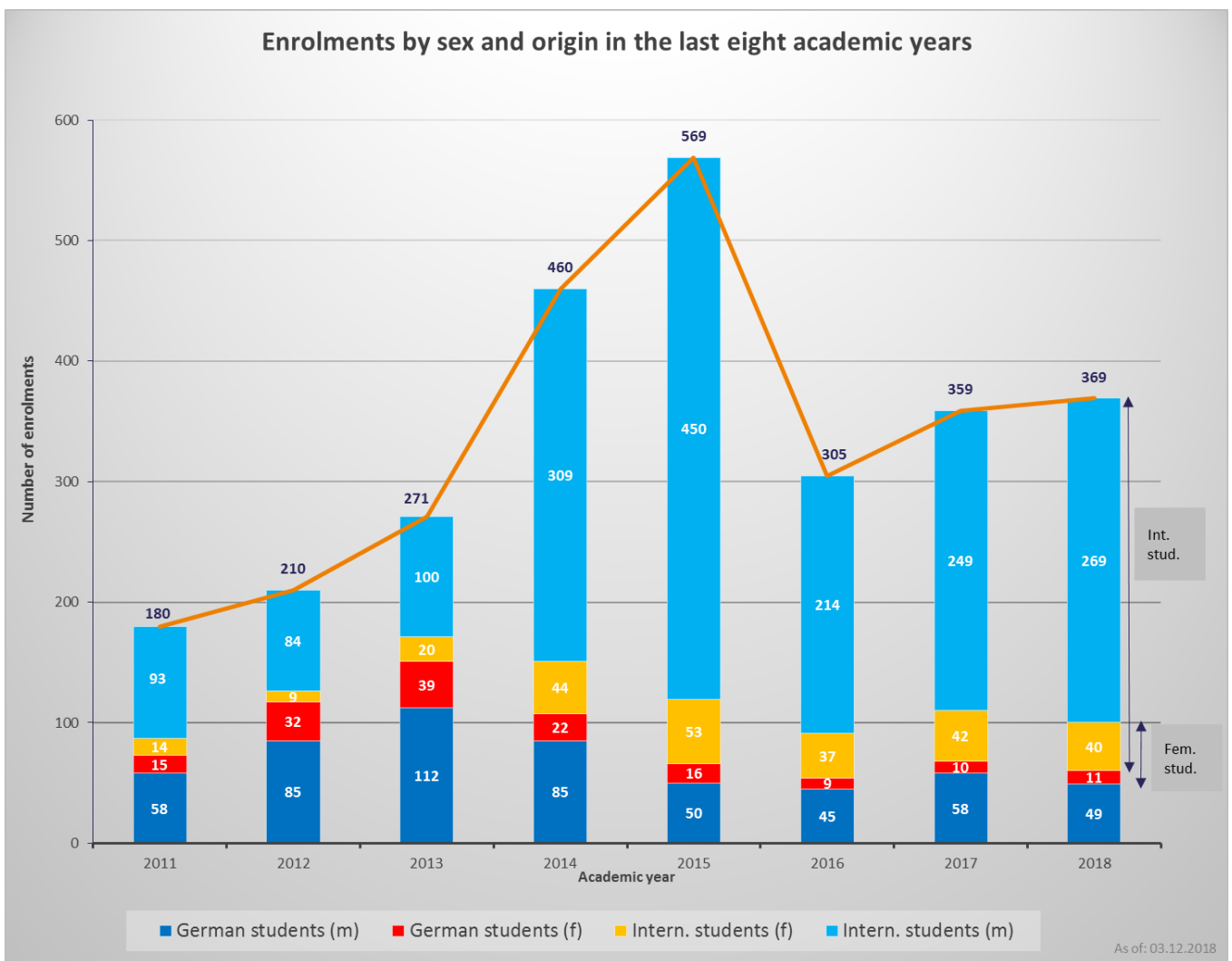


2 Faculty of Technology and Bionics
