International Perspectives and Intercultural Communication

Have you **already earned an undergraduate degree**, but find you are not quite ready for a master's yet? Are you disappointed with the current job market as a new graduate? Would you like to **enhance your résumé** with additional qualifications and improve your long term **career prospects**?

Then consider enrolling in the Future Semester certificate programme offered by Rhine-Waal and Ruhr-West Universities of Applied Sciences. Choose between several exciting specialisation paths!

What can you expect from a specialisation in International Perspectives and Intercultural Communication?

- You will add a new international dimension to your undergraduate degree.
- You will experience internationalisation for yourself think, act and live an international mindset.
- You will expand your horizons, gain deeper insight into other cultures, and strengthen your intercultural skills.
- You will learn to speak with more confidence and conviction: effective communication will become a key strength.
- You will improve your proficiency in foreign languages, both in technical areas (several to choose from in English) as well as your general proficiency in other languages (English, German as a Foreign Language, Mandarin Chinese, Spanish and more).
- You will develop your ability to tackle business issues with an international approach (as opposed to strictly national or regional).
- You will gain deeper insight into international economies and commerce, as well as real-world international practices in select corporate fields. You will practice applying this new insight through the analysis of case studies.

What are the learning objectives of a specialisation in International Perspectives and Intercultural Communication?

A specialisation in International Perspectives and Intercultural Communication will help prepare you for a career in an international environment and/or at an internationally-active company. You will acquire fundamental knowledge and skills in the global economy and international trade. An additional emphasis is put on improving your proficiency in foreign languages: in addition to advanced modules in English, you will also being learning a new language or improving your existing proficiency, while also strengthening your intercultural competence. A specialisation in International Perspectives and Intercultural Communication is the right choice if you would like to pursue a career in an internationally-active company or are planning your own startup that you would eventually like to introduce to the international marketplace.

What do modules in this specialisation entail?

- Fundamentals of the global economy, international trade and/or internationalisation as a corporate strategy
- Fundamentals of (intercultural) communication
- Practice-oriented exploration of internationalisation practices in select corporate areas
- Deeper economic insight into a cultural region of your choosing
- Acquiring and improving foreign language proficiency (English and an additional language of your choosing)

A total of 5 modules selected from 4 areas must be successfully completed to earn a certificate of specialisation. Note that you cannot select modules that you have already passed during your undergraduate studies.

Specialisation overview

Learning Agreement

The Future Semester is a one-semester certificate programme offered jointly by Rhine-Waal and Ruhr-West Universities of Applied Sciences. It is not a degree programme, but rather a professional training programme that builds upon the knowledge and proficiency students acquired in their undergraduate studies at either of the aforementioned universities. The specialisation certificate is generally obtainable in one semester.

A total of 25-30 CP must be earned to successfully conclude the programme and be awarded the certificate. This generally corresponds to five modules which must be passed at either Rhine-Waal or Ruhr-West Universities of Applied Sciences.

A Learning Agreement defining which five modules each student will complete will be concluded during the first four weeks of lectures. At least three of these must be subject-specific modules (see module overview).

Please also read and understand the examination regulations for the Future Semester programme, which are applicable to both universities.

Students enrolled in the Future Semester programme will be granted admission to the corresponding university for the agreed-upon modules in the Learning Agreement. Accordingly, a Learning Agreement is a mandatory requirement for registration in the chosen modules for both universities.

Please be aware that in some modules partial performance examinations (*Teilleistung-sprüfungen*) may already occur in the first weeks of instruction. Thus we strongly advise you to conclude your Learning Agreements as soon as possible so that you do not miss any lectures.

Ineligible modules

When concluding your Learning Agreement please be aware that you cannot select modules that you have already passed during your undergraduate studies. As a rule of thumb: you cannot select a module which shares at least two-thirds of the learning outcomes of a module that you passed as an undergraduate.

Module overview

To obtain a specialisation certificate in International Perspectives and Intercultural Communication, a total of 25-30 credits must be earned. This must include: 2 modules from International Perspectives and Intercultural Communication, 1 module from *Länderkundliches Wissen*, 1 module from *Fachenglisch* and 1 module from *Weitere Fremdsprachen*.
