

Admission Requirements

Specific requirements for Sustainable Development Management M.A.:

- Undergraduate degree in social sciences, economics or industrial/business engineering
- Your undergraduate degree must have consisted of at least 180 credits (ECTS) with a Learning Agreement required, or 210 credits (ECTS), i.e. seven full-time semesters of study
- Overall grade for your undergraduate degree of a 2.5 or ٠ better according to the German grading scale (equivalent to a B or better on the ECTS scale)
- English level B2 (with internationally recognised certifi-٠ catel
