WHAT?

The four bachelor programmes will be discontinued, new engineering bachelor programmes will start in winter 25/26.

All students enrolled in the four bachelor programmes *Electrical and Electronics Engineering, Industrial Engineering, Mechanical Engineering* and *Mechatronic Systems Engineering*, can stay enrolled and complete their studies until **February 28th 2030**.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN IN DETAIL?

COURSE OFFER

Gradually phased out: The scheduled lectures of a semester are discontinued after the last enrolment cohort has completed this semester according to the study plan (curriculum). In other words, lectures from first semester modules will be given in winter semester 2024/25 for the last time. Lectures from second semester modules will be discontinued after summer semester 2025, and so on; see the table.

EXAMINATIONS

Will be offered for minimum three more times after the corresponding lecture will have been given for the last time. Example: if lectures from third semester modules will be given in winter 2025/26 for the last time, the corresponding exam will be offered until winter 2027/28.

INTERNSHIP/ SEMESTER ABROAD

The practical semester and the semester abroad (sixth semester as per curriculum) can be conducted at any time, as long as you fulfil the requirements, but latest in summer semester 2029.

THESIS & COLLOQUIUM

The thesis and the colloquium can be completed at any time, as long as you fulfil the requirements, but the thesis must be registered latest by 30.09.2029.

CHANGE OPTIONS

New enrolments into the first semester of these degree programmes will no longer be possible from winter semester 2024/25 on. Enrolments into a higher semester - for that you need minimum 15 transferable credit points - are only possible under certain conditions as follows:

Changing the degree programme to one of the discontinued degree programmes will be possible for the last time for winter semester 2025/26. Your application must be handed in latest by 15.06.2025.

Parallel enrolments into one of the discontinued degree programmes will no more be possible.

WHAT SHOULD I DO?

- 1 Review Your Academic Progress:** Take a close look at your academic progress, identify which courses and exams you still need to complete.
- 2 Consult Academic Advisors:** Reach out to your academic advisors or head of the degree programme for personalized guidance.
- 3 Plan Your Course Schedule:** Prioritize taking remaining courses and exams within the designated timelines to avoid any delays in your academic progress.
- 4 Explore Transfer Options:** If you are considering transferring to a different programme or institution, start researching your options early. Contact admissions offices at other institutions to understand their transfer policies and application processes.
- 5 Stay Informed:** Regularly check official communication channels such as emails, university websites, and the Moodle course (see QR-code) for updates regarding course offerings, exam schedules, and any additional information. Ask counseling services, career guidance, and academic support.
- 6 Stay Proactive and Organized:** Maintain clear communication with staff, follow deadlines for course registration and exam applications, and keep track of your academic documents and transcripts.
